Afternoon Dismissal Last term we changed our afternoon dismissal procedure. This was to ensure that all children were in the right place to travel home after school. ASC children are picked up in the same area by Flavia. All other children stay with their teacher until their parent or carer arrives in the main playground. Curriculum News



Project Feathertail Glider This term Stage 3 (Years 5 and 6) are lucky enough to be involved in an amazing Challenge-based Learning program called **'Project Feathertail Glider'**. We are so excited to be involved in this very special project run by Taronga Zoo and supported by the CSO and Northern Beaches Council. It is an incredibly engaging and empowering unit of work that is designed so the students are actively involved in helping to solve a real world problem.

In this integrated unit the students will be guided through an inquiry learning experience focusing on the Feathertail Glider and the recovery and preservation of this species into the future. Students will be empowered to educate the local community about how they can help save this amazing local species designing, making and displaying a campaign product that educates the wider community about the issues facing the Glider and ways Northern Beaches residents can make a difference to protecting this species. They will be mentored through the project by Year 10 students from Mater Maria.

Next week we visit Taronga Zoo to learn more about these amazing creatures and meet our mentors and in Week 4, we visit Attunga Reserve in Newport, a native habitat for the Feathertail Glider.

We will also be installing a nest box in the playground to support the 'Habitat in Schools Project'. We will let you know more about this as the date for installation approaches.

In Week 9 we will be holding a School Expo day, where the students will showcase their presentations/ projects that they have worked on in the term. In Week 10 we are involved in a Community Expo day. We will also let you know more about this later in the term!

School Musical 2017 Can you believe nearly two years has passed since our last school music? Mrs Appleton and I are so excited that musical time is with us again! We are well underway in the script writing process and we auditioned Years 5 and 6 last term. In a few weeks we will begin to teach the classes their performance items.



As the term progresses, we will ask for parent volunteers for jobs such as costuming and make-up. For the time being, make sure you set aside the date *Thursday 23rd November* (Term 4, Week 7).

Through a program, the Mercy sisters of the mission teach the women to make beautiful handicrafts.

During her talk, Mrs. Rajca was able to show the children slides of Candela, the women and the children and explained how their donations from the sale of the crafts items give the women an income so they can provide for their families.



All funds raised go back to the women who have made the goods and in some cases have helped the building of bathrooms and toilets that they would otherwise not have.

It was wonderful to see so much activity during the Monday and Tuesday lunch times, when students in Year 6 created a stall and sold many of the beautiful and very popular craft items.


