School Improvement Plan (SIP) and Learning statements

The Teaching and Learning goal for our SIP 2020-2022 is:

To develop learners who show initiative, take risks and are proactive in their learning

Last year as part of our work to achieve this goal the staff developed a set of *Learning Statements* to guide us in what we are striving for in our classroom environments and the learning dispositions we are instilling in the students.

- Students enjoy a physical freedom of space and environment for learning effectively. Includes different group settings as appropriate to the lesson.
- Wall displays are evidence of teaching, student input and progression of the learning cycle.
- Student goals are evident (desk, wall, books).
- Learning Intentions and co-constructed success criteria as appropriate are evident in the classroom.
- Evidence of on task behaviour with student engagement in tasks, with authentic dialogue about thinking and learning, and students making decisions about their learning. Students are striving for the next step- a growth mindset approach to learning is evident.
- Students are aware of what they are learning and why they are learning it and able to articulate about it (learning is purposeful, meaningful, authentic)

The teachers will talk about these statements at Monday night's meetings.

NAPLAN 2021 – Yrs 3 and 5 Students

Information from Catholic Schools Broken Bay

In preparation for **NAPLAN Online** in **2021**, your child's school will complete a **NAPLAN Online Practice Test** in Term One . The practice test will provide an opportunity for students in Yrs 3, 5, 7 and 9 to familiarize themselves with the types of questions, tools and functions on the NAPLAN Online tests. This test will take place at your school between Monday 22nd March and Thursday 1st April 2021. Your child's school will also take part in the *Coordinated Practice Test* (CPT) that is scheduled for Thursday 25th March 2021.

The **NAPLAN Online Assessment Tests for 2021** are scheduled to be held within the period 11th - 21st May 2021. Students will complete the following online assessments in this order:

- Writing Test (11 13 May Test Window)
- Reading Test (12 21 May Test Window)
- Conventions of Language (12 21 May Test Window)
- Numeracy Test (13 21 May Test Window)

How to order

- 2. Naomi checks stock when she is next in school
- 3. Item(s) are sent home with your child for you to try on/decide if you would like to purchase
- 4. Any items you do not want, send back to school office
- 5. Any items you want to keep, text Naomi to let her know and THEN make your payment in Qkr.

Please DO NOT pay for items on Qkr before you have received the uniform items.

When you volunteer for the first time please attend the office to complete a <u>Volunteer Declaration Form</u> and provide ID (drivers licence). You will also be taken through a short induction regarding emergency procedures at St Joseph's.

Compass Parent Portal

There are two ways to access Compass - using the parent portal on any modern web browser or using the 'Compass School Manager' app on your mobile device. Parents can enter full day absences, access student academic reports, school calendar and update contact numbers and email addresses via Compass. All parents have their own individual login details (emailed direct to you from the CSO). Parent guides can be found on the Compass Parent Portal page of our website <u>here</u>.
