Parent engagement in 2021 - open classrooms each term

Safe drop off and pick up

The safety of ALL our children is paramount. For that reason alone, I ask that parents obey the road rules at drop off and pick up time (see later in the newsletter for the rules for afternoon pick up using the kiss n ride zone).

The drop off zone in the morning is a NO PARKING zone. You must drop your child off without getting out of the car and they walk to the gate. If you need to walk your child into school, please park in a legal space and walk them in. The council rangers do patrol this area before and after school, that is the secondary reason for obeying the road rules, you do not want to be fined.

All families will receive a Project Compassion Box today to help support Caritas Australia. By



When you volunteer for the first time please attend the office to complete a <u>Volunteer Declaration Form</u> and provide ID (drivers licence). You will also be taken through a short induction regarding emergency procedures at St Joseph's.

Compass Parent Portal

There are two ways to access Compass - using the parent portal on any modern web browser or using the 'Compass School Manager' app on your mobile device. Parents can enter full day absences, access student academic reports, school calendar and update contact numbers and email addresses via Compass. All parents have their own individual login details (emailed direct to you from the CSO). Parent guides can be found on the Compass Parent Portal page of our website here.


