If your child has to stay at home as a close contact you can access the NESA digital learning modules appropriate to their grade for 'self-paced learning' at home. Your child's teacher will be in contact with you via email if this is the case.

In brief:

 all students need to be tested on Monday and Wednesday before attending school (this could be the night before at bedtime if easier for your family). Use the RAT provided by school. See insert below from govt site:

For the first 4 weeks of Term 1, we recommend students take a RAT twice a week on mornings before attending school.

- o If your child has even mild COVID-19 symptoms, get them tested with a RAT or PCR (nose and throat swab) test.
- They must isolate until they receive a negative test result, in line with health protocols.
- o If symptoms continue, they should stay at home and take another RAT in 24 hours or have a PCR test. If the second RAT or initial PCR test result is negative, or another diagnosis is confirmed such as hay fever, they can return to school.
- please do not send your child to school if they are feeling unwell. Children who are unwell will be brought to the school sick bay and parents contacted to collect them;
- If your child has had Covid there is some particular advice on the govt site:
 - It is recommended that staff and students that return to school after recovering from COVID-19 do not participate in rapid antigen test surveillance for 28 days (four weeks after recovery) following release from self-isolation. This is due to NSW Health advice that people who have recovered from COVID-19 have a low risk of contracting it again in the following 28 days. After 28 days (from week five after recovery) staff and students may resume participation in RAT surveillance.
- no visitors to the school site until further notice from the govt. There are some exceptions to this which we will inform you if needed;
- thank you for adhering to the drop off and afternoon pick up procedures from last year. Please remember if your child is in Year 3-6 they will not be dismissed until 3.05pm. Please do not wait in the drive by pick up zone before this time if you have older children;

Beginning of Year Liturgy

This morning for the first time since 2019, we celebrated our beginning of year liturgy in the church with Kinder and Year 6 parents invited - it was so wonderful to celebrate together and ask for God's blessings on our year. It was meant to be a Mass but unfortunately Father Robert and Father Aldrin are now in isolation due to Covid. I ask your prayers for them and all other families in the same position. We presented leadership badges to our 2022 Year 6 leaders and we look forward to their responsible leadership of our school this year, already they are stepping up to this task superbly.

Parent/Teacher information sessions this week

Thank you to those parents who attended their child's class to hear from the teacher about expectations and learning for the year. The curriculum newsletters also give you an insight into the learning happening in your child's class. Our teachers are very accessible, it's one of the advantages of a small school, and all provided their email address to you. This is the best way to communicate initially with class teachers. They will always get back to you but be aware they are teaching and preparing all day and often attend meetings before and after school so there could be a delay of up to 48 hours. If it's something urgent, call Kerrie at the office.

Teachers are now into the routine of learning with classes. Data such as the MAI maths assessment data and reading levels is entered on our school student tracking portal called 'Student on a Page'. Every teacher can very quickly look at the assessment and other data on students using this new system implemented by the CSBBB late last year. This allows teachers to more easily plan and differentiate learning for their class. Some classes have begun home learning tasks and others will be in the next 2 weeks.

Clarification of canteen operation and Qkr ordering

- The canteen is open Mondays and Fridays <u>provided we have volunteers</u>.
- Any student who wishes to buy <u>lunch</u> from the canteen needs to have a Qkr lunch order placed.
- Lunch orders can be submitted on Qkr two weeks in advance.
- Please avoid trying to order "on the morning" as Qkr gets very busy and you may not be able to process your order.
- Please take note of the date you select for "order delivery". There is a two week period on the screen to choose from.
- On dates where we do not have volunteers, you cannot "accidentally" place a Qkr order. The system is closed off.
- Please check the newsletter weekly to see when the canteen is open.
- Volunteers must sign-in at the school office prior to working in the canteen.

Safety issue at kiss n drop before and after school

A reminder that the kiss n drop zone outside the school is not a place to park and then walk your child to the gate. This causes congestion for other cars waiting to drop off children. If your child needs escorting, please park elsewhere and walk them to the gate.

In the afternoon there are only 3 allocated places for cars to line up. If it is full please do not block off the corner, go around the block and try again. This may take time but it is about the safety of ALL of the children.

- Names and residential addresses of the students' parent(s) and/or guardian(s)

School Student Travel Term 1 2022



School student travel information for parents and students

School Travel Passes

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to apply or update their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local</u> bus operator to discuss their travel needs.

New Student Opal cards (including new Term Bus Passes) will be sent to the student's nominated postal address within two weeks of their application being approved.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

Students using Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Opal terms of use.

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct</u>. The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.
