The 2019 NAPLAN parent letters arrived at school yesterday from NESA and will be sent home with your child today. Please check their school bag if they forget to hand it to you. The results are accompanied by an explanation letter from NESA on how to read the results for your child and reference to a website if needed.

At this early stage of analysing the results we are very pleased with the increase in our school average in comparison to the state and 'like' schools. Our data is trending up in all areas this year for both Year 3&5 with some excellent growth for Year 5 students from their Year 3 results.

Compass Parent Portal is now “live”

Individual login details have been emailed to parents

All parents should have received an email on Friday 13 September with information about our new Compass Parent Portal and App, including login details. The new system will enable you to access information online about your child/ren, anytime, anywhere, from any modern web-enabled device.

To ensure you receive Compass notifications on your mobile device, please remember to enable this functionality. Simply press the Allow button when prompted during the installation of the Compass School Manager app.

Please log into Compass if you have not already done so, check that your contact details are current, and update if necessary. This will ensure we can communicate effectively with you.

When using the Parent Portal via computer or mobile APP, you will be able to:

- Enter explanations for absences, ie if your child is absent for the day you will now enter it via the App in the morning – no need to email or phone the school
- View information on your child/ren's attendance
- Receive communications
- Update your contact details



The Compass Kiosk in the school foyer looks like a large iPad and is to be used by parents who pick up their child/ren early, for late arrivals, and for sign in by all visitors to the school.

All late arrivals and early departures must be entered into the Compass Kiosk in the foyer by a **PARENT**.

Late children should not be dropped at the gate to walk in unaccompanied.

Absences of 10 or more school days will still need to be applied for using the [Application for Extended Leave - Form A1](#) found on our school website. This form should be printed, filled in and handed in to the school office with supporting documentation.

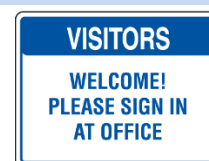
