Assistant Principal News: Attendance at School

At school, one of our jobs is to monitor attendance of the students. In the ATTENDANCE POLICY FOR THE DIOCESAN SCHOOLS SYSTEM, based on the Department of Education and Training policy it states:

Regular school attendance is essential if students are to maximise their potential. Schools, in partnership with parents, are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students. The Diocesan Schools System of Broken Bay (**DSS**) works with schools to ensure this objective is realised. While parents are legally responsible for the regular attendance of their children, school staff members monitor student attendance daily including part or whole day absences, as a consequence of both their duty of care and legislative requirements.

Parents are responsible for:

- ensuring that their children attend school every day the school is open for instruction
- explaining, to the school, the reasons for the absences of their children promptly and within seven days taking measures to resolve attendance issues involving their children

For this reason we will be sending out Compass generated emails every fortnight, if you have not provided a reason for your child's absence.

At the end of this week you may receive one of these emails, and it may date back to the start of Term 3. Apologies, I realise initially that this is a long time frame, but we have new processes in place that we must adhere to.

PLEASE GO ONTO COMPASS IF YOUR CHILD IS NOT AT SCHOOL SO THAT OUR ATTENDANCE RECORDS ARE AS UP TO DATE AS POSSIBLE. IF WE DO NOT RECEIVE A REASON IN 7 DAYS THE LEAVE WILL BE MARKED AS 'UNJUSTIFIED'.




Sports News

School Opal Cards

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now apply online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should re-apply or update their details.

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.





Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new <u>eligibility criteria</u>, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2020 to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Compass Parent Portal

There are two ways to access Compass - using the parent portal on any modern web browser or using the 'Compass School Manager' app on your mobile device. Parents can enter full day absences, access student academic reports, school calendar and update contact numbers and email addresses via Compass. All parents have their own individual login details (emailed direct to you from the CSO).

WHOLE DAY ABSENCE Enter via the APP on your phone (sick, holiday) – you do not need to change the times, the default of "8am to 5pm" covers the school day. Absences of 10 or more days - Request for Leave form must be submitted to the office as well as entering via APP
