CONFIRMATION 2017

Our children have now completed their third week of the Sacramental Program preparation for Confirmation. In session three they have learnt about the 'Fruits'; the qualities we have when we grow in faith; and the 'Gifts' of the Holy Spirit that the Bishop will pray on Confirmation day that they will be filled with these 'Gifts'.

In session two the children were asked to think about their Confirmation, 'Saints' name that they will have chosen and talk about being "called by name" at our Baptism.

They also read the story of the Annunciation and how Mary said "Yes" to God and how we all can say "Yes" to God. At their first session, the children focused on Baptism and remembered that this is when they were welcomed into the Catholic Church and our Community.

They reflected on the symbols of Baptism and remembered the story of when Jesus was Baptised in the Jordan and that he heard God say to him

"You are my Beloved son; in you I am well pleased".

The children will learn that this is what God says to each one of them, and us, at Baptism.

Curriculum News

Project Feathertail Glider In Week 3, Stage 3 had their visit to Taronga Zoo, to learn more about the Feathertail Gliders and we also met our mentors who are students from Year 10, Mater Maria. Last week, we visited Attunga Reserve in Newport, a native habitat for the Feathertail Glider.

On Tuesday this week a nest box was installed in the playground to support the 'Habitat in Schools Project'. Helping Feathertail Gliders and other wildlife can be done in many ways, but one very helpful way is to create a habitat in our own school or backyard. By planting a cluster of native plants which could then connect with our neighbour's native plants and their neighbour's native plants.... you can eventually create a Wildlife Corridor!



Wildlife Corridors allow native animals to travel more safely through urban areas when moving from one bushland area to another. The type of nest-box our school was given is built to attract a Musk Lorikeet or a Ringtail Possum, this is what is most likely to be found at our school. Native plants provide homes and food for our animals and shade and oxygen for people, so the Northern Beaches Council supplied us with a collection of native seed stock-plants, which comprise of a mix of ground cover, shrubs and a canopy plants to create some school habitat. We have agreed to provide a water source for wildlife as part of the habitat space. We look forward to teaching all our students about how to look after these areas by walking around the gardens instead of through them!

We will also have the use of a Wildlife camera, to monitor the nest-box. We will have this camera for two weeks. Students will have the opportunity to review footage and log animal sightings on a graph in their student journals. This information can be shared with other schools through the Blogger web page. The schools will then be able to compare data and species types from school to school.

As you can see, this is an exciting project for not only our Stage 3 students, but for the entire school!


