First Communion

Over the past 3 weekends children from our school and all of the Lakes Parish have been receiving the Eucharist for the first time at parish Mass with their family. At the Masses I have attended at St Joseph's it has been so lovely to observe the awe and reverence of the children as they receive the Eucharist surrounded by their family. Today the school came together for a thanksgiving Mass for these children where they received communion as part of our St Joseph's school community. As usual the Mass was full of beautiful music and singing from the children. Afterwards the first communion children celebrated with a small party.

Farewell to Father Rex

Our school Mass today was the last Father Rex will be the presider as he retires on 1 July. Father Rex has always valued and encouraged the gifts of the children, giving those children who are interested opportunities to develop their skills in service to the church. His homilies at our school Masses always have a message the children can connect to their own lives and experience. I also thank Father Rex for his support of me in my role over the last year and his leading of our parish with the principles of Divine Renovation.

On Sunday you are all welcome to the 9.30am Parish Family Mass where we will farewell Father Rex as a Parish. It will be followed by morning tea in the hall.

Author afternoon tea

On Tuesday afternoon we had the privilege and pleasure of 5 visiting authors and an illustrator who spoke to the children in class groups about their books and the writing process. The children loved hearing first hand from 'real' writers, how they find their ideas and how they also struggle sometimes to compose text for an audience. Thanks to our librarian Fran Jones for organising this great learning opportunity.

Teachers Professional Learning

Teachers are always learning, striving to improve and design learning for students that meets curriculum requirements as well as 'point of need' for the class and individuals. This term we have focussed on the teaching of maths, incorporating learning principles such as perseverance and meeting the challenge. Stage 3 teachers have participated in a Diocesan project titled EPMC (Encouraging Persistence, Maintaining challenge) that we have also applied in an adjusted way to Stage 2. We had visits from the Diocesan primary maths education officers to assist us with our understanding and help us reflect on practice. Stage 1 and early stage 1 focussed on teaching 'number sense' effectively as this is the foundation for all mathematical understanding.
