Celebrating God's Love

This term the children will be exploring the Love that God has shared with his people. They will develop a deeper understanding of the Prophets of the Old Testament as well as the story of Christmas and the coming of God's son Jesus.

English

Reading & Viewing Guided reading takes place in groups. Children are monitored and assessed regularly and groups are fluid. Children will continue to develop their understanding of the following comprehension strategies;

- * activating prior knowledge * predicting
- * self monitoring

* questioning

- * making connections * visualising
- * summarising and retelling
- * inferring
- * synthesising

Writing and Representing, Spelling and Grammar

This term the children will be writing Persuasive Text - focusing on television and magazine advertising and Imaginative Text- this will have a Christmas Focus.

Speaking and Listening and Vocabulary

Speaking and Listening will be part of all KLA'S; They will be making their own television commercials and presenting information to their peers at various times.

Science & Technology - Material World

We will investigate and identify ways that everyday materials can be physically changed and combined for a particular purpose and will discover that everyday materials can be physically changed in a variety of ways.

Mathematics

Students will participate in the Mathematical strands individually, in groups and as a whole class through a variety of activities. Maths challenges are set at student's level of understanding. Children will be focusing on developing persistence when challenged by new concepts.

Supporting tasks can be also found on Study Ladder. This term the children will be introduced to a Maths Google classroom where they will also have some optional Maths tasks set for them to extend their learning.

Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE) Who Am I?
