# Religious Education

### Mission: Reaching out with Jesus

In this module students will develop an understanding and appreciation of the nature and challenges of Christian mission through their study of Jesus' instructions in the 'Mission of the Twelve' (Lk 9: 1-6). Students will investigate the work of Catholic Mission and individuals committed to reaching out to others. Students will be encouraged to consider practical ways to reach out to others and be part of the mission of Jesus.

#### **Advent to Christmas**

They will explore how the Gospel writers told the story of Jesus as the person whom God would send, and that this belief has become central to our faith as Christians. In exploring the meaning of Christmas, students identify ways in which they can, like Jesus, be witnesses to the fulfilment of God's promises.

# **English**

Reading: Judy Blume- Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing series, guided (Books from the Tristars series) and independent reading linked to comprehension skills, grammar, vocabulary, writing skills.

Modelled, shared, guided and independent reading linked to comprehension skills, grammar, vocabulary, writing skills.

Writing: Persuasive, Informative and Imaginative text types

<u>Spelling</u>: words related to the vocabulary study, personalised words and theme words

<u>Speaking and Listening</u>: Students will be encouraged to present facts to the class, to read or recite poetry, or other pieces of writing. We will also continue to focus on developing the student's vocabulary.

<u>Handwriting</u>: Focus on moving from manuscript handwriting to cursive handwriting

#### Mathematics

Students will participate in the Mathematical strands individually, in groups and as a whole class through a variety of activities. We incorporate open-ended tasks and hard thinking to challenge the students at their point of need. Our focus this term will be on the following areas:
