Year 5 2019 Curriculum Overview Term One

The primary school curriculum is divided into seven Key Learning Areas (subjects). Below is a brief outline of what we will be learning in each of these areas throughout Term 1.

Religious Education

The modules we will be studying this term are *Sacraments of Service* and *Lent to Easter.*

Sacraments of Service: In this module, students are encouraged to reflect upon the nature of their own vocation and how it is to be lived out in their daily lives. Students will relate the service of married couples and priests to the family and the parish with the meaning and celebration of the sacraments of Marriage and Holy Orders.

Lent to Easter: In this module students will explore the purpose and potential of the Lenten practices of almsgiving, prayer and fasting, exploring the themes of Lent and Easter in a creative and integrated way.



Science and Technology

Coding 3.0 - Stage 3 of the Digital Technologies strand focuses on understanding the role individual components of digital systems play in processing and representing data. Students design, modify and follow algorithms involving branching and iteration. Stage 3 of this strand further develops students' knowledge and understanding of project management, abstraction and the relationship between models and the real-world systems they represent.

Sustainable Management - Stage 3 of the Living World strand focuses on the growth and survival of living things and how their adaptations over time suit their environment. Students investigate how and why food and fibre are produced in sustainable, managed environments that enable people to grow and be healthy. This strand further develops students' knowledge and understanding of the environmental and biological sciences.

Geography and History taught in Terms 2,3 and 4.



English

Each day the students take part in modelled, shared or independent reading. The students are grouped for reading and either work in a small instructional group with the teacher or independently or cooperatively when they are not with the teacher. Our class novel this term is *A Long Walk to Water* by Linda Sue Park.Our English program includes a range of different group formats, including small group work, whole class work, partnerships and individual work.

The students take part in the construction of shared and independent texts. Grammar, Spelling and Vocabulary_learning will take place in the context of Reading, Writing, Speaking and Listening. We will have a major focus on Narratives and Persuasive texts in both Reading and Writing.

Students experience a variety of activities that develop their communication skills, including asking questions, discussion with peers, being an attentive listener, responding to information and stories. Students will also have opportunities to read at whole school Liturgies.



Mathematics

Students will participate in the Mathematical strands individually, in groups and as a whole class through a variety of activities. Our studies this term will be centred on the following areas:

Whole Number	Fractions & Decimals
Angles	Chance
Multiplication & Division	Area
3D Space	Volume & Capacity

Students will be challenged and extended through hard thinking challenges and problem solving at their point of need.
