NAPLAN online

Today our years 3 & 5 students had a practice test for NAPLAN online. All schools in the Diocese of Broken Bay will be sitting the NAPLAN assessment in May as an online text this year. The practice test helps the students to use the online tools and become familiar with the format, it is not an actual test of the level of questions. NESA has set up a public online platform so that students can practise at home too. See the links below for more information.

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy – important skills that each child needs to succeed in school and life. The NAPLAN tests are designed to help us make sure students are on track with their literacy and numeracy development. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in NAPLAN tests for reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

Between 14-17 May 2019, our school will participate in NAPLAN Online. Please ensure your child is at school on these days. Students do not need to be computer experts to take the NAPLAN test online. Making sure students have computer skills is part of our school curriculum, and our teachers will ensure your child is familiar with the online format. Curriculum News

Curriculum Corner

Over the course of this term, the teaching staff has undergone regular professional learning that is linked to the **School Improvement Plan (SIP)** and the specific goals St Joseph's is working towards.

Earlier in the term we investigated our **English teaching** with a lens on our **SIP goal in the domain of learning and teaching 'to increase the learning growth of all students**'. We spent time talking about refining our practice in English. As a staff we looked with more precision into the feedback we give students that enable them to recognise their strengths and areas for development. Feedback provides explicit information on how the students can improve in their learning, enabling the student's to set **their own learning goal.** This gives the students **agency in their learning (Broken Bay Learning Principle #3)**. This specifically addresses understanding that learners should be the drivers, rather than the passengers, in their learning.

We have also spent time in *Mathematics* looking at our *MAI (Mathematical Assessment Interview)* results as a school and what they tell us about our students. As a staff we highlighted *what our learners know and understand* where we would we like their understanding to move forward and how can we influence this learning? We spent time looking at specific activities that will help our students to deepen their conceptual understandings in the areas where they need support to progress and maintain deep knowledge. We are excited by the possibilities for growth that lay ahead for our students.

Our **Pastoral Care goal is 'to focus on student wellbeing for learning'**. Yesterday we looked closely at our students' **social and emotional learning (SEL)**. This is the process through which children and adults understand and manage emotions, set and achieve positive goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions. We know that a student's SEL competencies not only prepare them for learning, they also impact a student's capacity to learn. As a staff we looked at our SEL data and explored resources to find teaching and learning activities that will support us to teach the SEL skills that our specific students need.
