Dear Parents

What a wonderful two weeks of sunny weather we had for the holidays!

I hope you all had time to relax and unwind as a family and celebrate the Easter season. Thank you for organising your children for term 2 with uniforms and supplies and a positive attitude! We all look forward to an enjoyable term of learning and events.

A reminder about morning and afternoon routines

Teachers are on duty from 8.30am each day. If you need to drop your child to school earlier than that please access before school care. This is a WHS issue.

The playground equipment is out of bounds before and after school due to supervision rules. Please support us by not allowing your child to play on the equipment after school.

Teachers escort their class to the playground for dismissal each afternoon. We ask parents who are collecting children to wait on the basketball playground or near the hall to collect your child. This is so we can account for every child after school. Please keep your children with you after school as there is no supervision for children on the playground after school.

Other children will line up at *after school care, bus, walkers* or *kiss and ride* with a teacher on duty for each of these lines. Thank you for your co-operation in these safety management issues.

Internet safety

Every child in the school signs an agreement at the beginning of each year to use the internet appropriately whilst at school. The teachers outline what that agreement means and model appropriate procedures for logging on and searching on the internet. The CSO has system wide filters in place so that inappropriate content is blocked at school.

Children are curious when inappropriate content is talked about in their peer group and will sometimes try to access the content at school or home. If this occurs at school we speak with the child and depending on the offence will ban the child from internet usage for a period of time.

To support us, we ask that you speak with your child regularly about safe internet use at home and monitor their use of devices. There are many parent sites out there to assist with this. NAPLAN assessments in week 3 for years 3&5

From 14 May to 17 May, our school will participate in NAPLAN Online. The information brochure for parents and carers addresses common questions about NAPLAN Online testing.

One of the main features of the NAPLAN Online format is that it is a tailored (or adaptive) test. The tailored test provides a more precise assessment of your child's performance in the areas of reading, language conventions (grammar, spelling and punctuation) and numeracy by adapting to responses. As your child progresses through the test, questions may be easier or more difficult, to better assess his or her ability. Your child should not be concerned if he or she finds the questions more difficult than expected – the pathway may be more challenging. Many of the same questions appear in both paper and online tests, but not every student doing the online test will be answering the same questions in the same order.

Your child's NAPLAN results and scores are based on the number **and** complexity of questions he or she has answered correctly. If you have any questions about NAPLAN Online, please contact your child's teacher.
