A new student information system is on the way!



We are excited to let you know that our school community will shortly start using a new student information system called Compass. It is expected that Compass will be rolled out to all systemic Catholic schools in our diocese over the next six months.

What is Compass?

Compass is a whole school administration system. It will streamline many school operations such as attendance, reporting and communication.

How will this impact you?

Later this term you will receive details about a Parent Portal and App which will enable you to access information online about your child/ren, anytime, anywhere, from any modern web-enabled device. Initially you will be able to –

- View information on your child/ren's attendance
- Enter explanations for absences
- Enter late arrivals and early departures on our Compass Kiosk
- Receive school communications
- Update your contact details

More functionality will become available over time – we will keep you updated!





Stage 3 Kimbriki Tip Excursion

On Tuesday the 6th of August Stage 3 took their learning into the real world and visited Kimbriki Tip's Eco Garden. Students learnt so much about sustainability which we can't wait to share with the whole school!

Listen to what our students thought of this fantastic excursion:

I liked how we learnt new tips for building our greenhouses and worm farm, as well as getting to be able to hold a worm. I also liked how we had a tour around the tip and learnt facts about it. I was surprised on the toilets how we had to put mulch and a spray for normally we just have to flush.

My favourite part of the excursion was eating the oranges, the raspberries and learning about the bins and also holding the worms because it was a new experience for most of us. Also I liked using the toilets as they were very weird because you had to put the one cup of mulch in and spray water on it which is very different then the toilets we have in our home. I learnt that we have billions of tiny bacteria on our bodies and only 5% of it is bad and the 'dirt' we have in our household is actually flakes from our dead skin. I also learnt that worms are both female and male so they can reproduce without another worm. I strongly recommend this excursion to the other classes because while it was fun, it was very educational as well.

My favourite part of the excursion was when we were on the bus and seeing all of the things that were being recycled and the other 4 Rs. Also the toilets were a very different experience for all of us, as we normally just flush. One of the things I learned is that as Australians we are not good at recycling. But at Kimbriki they recycle 85% of the things that comes there. One other thing is that I now know how to assemble a worm farm for our school. We could teach others by us showing them how good it is for the environment and mostly for us to live.

I had two favourite parts of our excursion, one of them was seeing how they recycled the garden waste. I found the process of turning the garden waste into soil very interesting, they ground the branches, leaves and grass up which turned it to soil then sieved soil. I also liked the eco garden,



I loved tasting the fruit, holding the worms and looking at their vegepod. I learnt a lot about how to be sustainable. We learnt about the 5 R's (rethink, reuse, recycle, reduce and refuse) and how we can be sustainable at home and school. We can teach others to be more sustainable by setting an example, if we apply the three R's to our life they will too.
