Curriculum Overview Term Four

The primary school curriculum is divided into seven Key Learning Areas (subjects). Below is a brief outline of what we will be learning in each of these areas throughout Term 4.

| Geography The Earth's Environment It's easy being green - Reduce, Reuse, Recycle! This unit teaches students about waste and sustainability. It focuses on developing students' understanding of sustainability, which is about the ongoing capacity of the environment to sustain human life and wellbeing. Students recognise that people have different views on how sustainability can be achieved. They learn that sustainability means more than the careful use of resources and the safe management of waste. They also develop their understanding of the concept by exploring some of the other functions of the environment that support their lives and the lives of other living things. They investigate the custodial responsibility of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples to their country/place and their past and present views on the sustainable use of resources. | English Each day the students take part in modelled, shared, guided and independent reading. The students are grouped for reading and either work in a small instructional group with the teacher or independently or cooperatively when they are not with the teacher. Our class reading throughout the term will be heavily related to our Geography unit. The students take part in the construction of shared and independent texts. Grammar, Spelling and Vocabulary learning will take place in the context of Reading, Writing, Speaking and Listening. This term we will look at narratives & persuasive texts. |
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| Religious EducationMissionStudents will develop an understanding and appreciation of the nature and challenges of Christian mission through their study of Jesus' instructions in the 'Mission of the Twelve' (LK 9: 1-6). Students will investigate the work of Catholic Mission and individuals committed to reaching out to others. Students will be encouraged to consider practical ways to reach out to others and be part of the mission of Jesus.Advent to Christmas For Advent: Students will discover that during Old Testament times, the prophets reminded the people of their covenant with God. The students' will learn of the prophets' promise of a special person whom God would send to help them with the difficulties of their lives. They will explore how the Gospel writers told the story of Jesus as this person, and that this belief has become central to our faith as Christians.For Christmas: Students will be invited to consider the celebration of Jesus' birth at Christmas as a celebration of the fulfilment of God's covenant promise to send a saviour. In exploring the meaning of Christmas, students identify ways in which they can, like Jesus, be witnesses to the fulfilment of God's promises. | Mathematics Students will participate in the Mathematical strands individually, in groups and as a whole class through a variety of activities. Students will complete challenging and hard thinking tasks based on their individual needs. Our studies this term will be centred on the following areas: Whole Number Multiplication and Division 2D Space Patterns & Algebra Time Mass Volume & Capacity Fraction & Decimals Position |
