## **New School Improvement Plan (SIP)**

All schools in the Diocese of Broken Bay have School Improvement plans (**SIP**) which drive the educational direction of the school. The SIPs are a 3-year broad plan. Last year our school was reviewed on the outcomes of the previous SIP and a new SIP was developed based on the identified needs and the discernment process of our staff and the guidance of CSO education officers.

Goals are written for the 3 domains; Mission, Teaching & Learning and Pastoral Care.

Targets are set, strategies are developed and then these are measured and evaluated over the life of the SIP. The following table is the summary of our SIP goals and targets.

## **Curriculum News**

Our school SIP (school improvement plan) 2020 – 2023, in learning and teaching is:

#### To develop learners who show initiative, take risks and are proactive in their learning.

This week the staff had professional learning exploring the concept of *engaging all students in thinking and learning – creating a 'no hands-up' culture.* 

In order to increase the quantity and quality of student's oral language, it is important to move away from a traditional 'hands-up' culture, in which the teacher poses a question and some students raise their hand and answer.

The fundamental flaw in the traditional questioning model is that it makes participation voluntary. The confident students engage by raising their hands—and by engaging in classroom discussion, they become smarter. But others decline the invitation to participate and thus miss out on the chance to get smarter. Perhaps the simplest way to improve classroom questioning is simply not to ask for volunteers, but instead to choose a student at random. Students raise their hands only to ask questions, not to answer them. (Dylan Wiliam, 2014).

This makes 'think time' very important. Teacher's need to build in thinking time so all students have the processing time necessary to think about what their answer or explanation might be before they may be called upon to share.

Shifting practice away from a 'hands-up' approach to a culture of 'think, pair share' and other thinking, talking and sharing routines, is a powerful way to create not only a 'talking classroom' but a thinking, engaged learning environment. (Cameron and Dempsey, 2016).

#### **Compass Parent Portal**

There are two ways to access Compass - using the parent portal on any modern web browser or using the 'Compass School Manager' app on your mobile device. Parents can enter full day absences, access student academic reports, school calendar and update contact numbers and email addresses via Compass. All parents have their own individual login details (emailed direct to you from the CSO).
