The unique child, family connections and community. We look at the strengths of the child and how families can best nurture those abilities and skills.

Statements about learning to link with SIP

At the parent information sessions and also at the P&F meeting the goals of our new <u>School Improvement Plan</u> (<u>SIP</u>) were explained. Teachers have been unpacking these goals in their professional learning time to compose learning statements that describe what the vision is for the learning. What do we expect to see happening in our classrooms if we achieve these goals? What will the learners be like?

Here is a list of some of our learning statements in draft at the moment:

- Students enjoy a physical freedom of space and environment for learning effectively
- Work on display shows student progression and student input.
- Students are aware of what they are learning and why they are learning it. Learning is purposeful, meaningful and authentic.
- Students have a deep knowledge about their learning and are able to articulate that knowledge, deep thinking and wonderings
- Students show growth mindset in their approach to learning


Ash Wednesday

P&F News

On behalf of the St Joseph's P&F, I welcome everyone back to another exciting year.

As in past years, each class in the school has chosen two class parents who will oversee: 1) communications, 2) organise functions and 3) help with school fund-raising. Class parents do the majority of the parent organising for school events, and rely heavily on our parent community for help, so please step forward and be as involved as possible this year.

Last year we trialled a new process for collecting funds for class gifts and we shall be continuing with this in 2020. Parents voluntarily donate \$20 per child minimum (via QKR) into a P&F Contribution Class Fund, to be used by the class parent for gifts. These gifts include:

- a birthday gift to the class teacher;
- a year end present to all staff;
- small gifts to celebrate the arrival of a new baby
- bereavement cards

This process makes gifts more equitable amongst staff, simplifies collection of money by class parents during the year and also reduces the amount parents are requested to donate for gifts throughout the year. The QKR account will be open all year and all donations are completely anonymous.

Our first P&F General Meeting, last Monday night, was well attended and I encourage as many parents as possible to attend the meetings we have every term. This is where issues can be raised and decisions are made and the P&F executive welcomes everyone to attend. The St Joseph's community is already a very special one and more involvement from parents will only make that feeling of belonging more powerful.

The Lakes Parish Children's Choir has begun!


Rehearsals take place on Wednesday afternoons from 3:30pm-4:30pm in the Parish Hall, next to St. Joseph's Church in Narrabeen.

Compass Parent Portal

There are two ways to access Compass - using the parent portal on any modern web browser or using the 'Compass School Manager' app on your mobile device. Parents can enter full day absences, access student academic reports, school calendar and update contact numbers and email addresses via Compass. All parents have their own individual login details (emailed direct to you from the CSO).

WHOLE DAY ABSENCE Enter via the APP on your phone (sick, holiday) – you do not need to change the times, the default of "8am to 5pm" covers the school day. Absences of 10 or more days - Request for Leave form must be submitted to the office as well as entering via APP
