A reminder that parents are now welcome to enter the school, for all drop offs, pick-ups etc. If you are entering the school please remember to check in using the QR code displayed all on the gates and all around the school. This means that as per our normal practice, if you are entering the school as a volunteer to work in the canteen, library or have a meeting with a teacher, (anything over 10 minutes) you need to come to the office and sign in at the Compass kiosk. This is so we can meet the contact tracing requirements.

Dear parents

I hope you all survived 'the big wet' over this week and are now drying out. Our school weathered the conditions quite well and we did not need to interrupt learning and close the school as many others did across our Diocese and state. It is very disappointing the years 3-6 students could not participate in the scheduled gala days this week due to rain and fields closed by the council. This morning at assembly I told the children it is disappointing but not a tragedy. A tragedy is what has occurred across the state with the loss of houses, pets, farms, businesses and livestock. Together, we dedicated our morning prayer to those who are suffering from the outcome of the floods.

NAPLAN 2021 (11-14 May)

In preparation for **NAPLAN Online** in **2021**, the year 3 and 5 classes will complete a **NAPLAN Online Practice Test** on Monday next week. The practice test will provide an opportunity for students to familiarize themselves with the types of questions, tools and functions on the NAPLAN Online tests. Today the classes also took part in the *Coordinated Practice Test* **(CPT)** for ACARA (the administrators of the National testing) to test the capabilities of the system in an online environment. Your child will not need any academic preparation for the practice test. This is not a test of their literacy and numeracy skills, but an opportunity for them to experience the online test format.

In the actual test week in May, Year 3 students will undertake **online** assessments for numeracy, reading and language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) but will do a **paper-based** NAPLAN writing test. Year 5 students will undertake **all** NAPLAN content areas (including writing) **online**.

If you have any concerns or questions about the NAPLAN assessments please contact the class teachers.

Holy Week

On Sunday we begin the most important liturgical week of the church year, Holy Week. Through participation and observation of the various liturgies through the week, your child will come to know the bible story that is the reason we celebrate Easter. Speak to your child during the week about what they've learnt and take time to reflect and discuss as a family the events of the week.

Of course next week at Wednesday afternoon assembly will be the drawing of the Easter raffle and there will be much excitement, however, it's reassuring to know our students realise that Easter is more than chocolate eggs and why chocolate eggs are given.

Holy Week

Next week is Holy Week, the final week of Lent. During this week we recall the events surrounding the suffering, Death and Resurrection of Jesus. Each stage will be responsible for sharing with the school a major part - Palm Sunday, The Last Supper and Washing of the Feet, Agony in the Garden and Stations of the Cross. As we pray and reflect during this week, we look forward with hope to Easter Sunday and the Resurrection.

Sacrament of Confirmation 2021 Program

This year our parish will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation on Saturday 21 August. Times are not known yet as it depends on the number of candidates who will celebrate the Sacrament.

Candidates need to be eight (8) years of age on or before 21 August and must have been baptised to be eligible to receive the Sacrament. If your child was not baptised within The Lakes Catholic Parish you will be asked to provide a copy of their Baptism Certificate after registration.


Days shaded red will open once we have the required number of volunteers.


