Dear parents

I hope you were able to acknowledge ANZAC DAY last Sunday on what was a beautiful weekend weather wise. The children participated in our own Anzac day liturgy on Monday morning, led so respectfully by our Year 6 leaders. The year 6 class had spent week 1 of the term reading texts, viewing documentary items and researching about the history, significance and symbols of ANZAC day as part of their learning in English and history. They modelled for us the respect we show at these types of ceremonies, thank you year 6!

Enrolments for kinder 2022

Last term we held an Open Day for prospective families interested in enrolling their child at our school for 2022. Many families have already submitted their paperwork and attended an interview with me with a position offered to their child. Enrolments are strong, we already have 22 on our data base and it's only the beginning of 2nd Term! It is my privilege to interview and speak with the families about their aspirations and expectations for their child's primary education. So many of them say that our school has a positive reputation in the local community as a friendly welcoming community and this is what they want for their child and family. They also mention the four core values we teach, model and embed in all that we do: Community, Respect, Stewardship and Compassion. These values are present in the Gospels and modelled to us by the deeds of Jesus and are just good values to live by.

Inclusion is as an action that reflects these values. We often talk about our small community as one of inclusion and we actively teach what this looks like to the children through the subjects of Religious Education and Personal Development. It is also something we need to model as adults, as we know our children learn so much not just by our words but by our deeds.

ANZAC Day

This week on Monday, Year 6 led a beautiful and reflective liturgy to remember the bravery of those men and women who fought and died so that we could stay free. It is important their sacrifice shall never be forgotten.

Last week, Year 6 watched and listened to many texts and videos depicting the first day at Gallipoli and other stories commemorating ANZAC traditions. The students then wrote some very emotive pieces of writing depicting their impressions of what it may have been like at Gallipoli on the first day.

The War

As I climb out of the boat my hearing is suspended by the screaming and explosions. I stumble onto the shoreline and the sand and dirt flies into my eyes, making me incapable of seeing. I feel something pulling on my shirt, I then look up to see another soldier dragging me to safety.

He then hands me a gun and tells me to start running to the trenches with the other soldiers. Bombs are going off left and right. I fall into a hole, making my rifle go off narrowly missing my face knocking off my helmet. I climb out of the hole and spot the dreadful sight of a dead body covered in blood.

I freeze like a deer staring into headlights. Just standing there. Gazing at the traumatizing sight. Next thing I notice a sharp pain shoots through my entire body. I collapse screaming in pain, I start to drag myself to the medical tents. Two soldiers hoist me onto a donkey and race me to the medical tents. I look up at the sky thinking this is the end. I blackout, then I wake up covered in bandages.

My legs were numb, I couldn't move, and I knew I couldn't go on. It was all pointless how stupid of me to think this would be fun. I try to tell the nurse that I want some water then I realise I can't talk. For me the war was over. **By Max Me.**

There are two ways to access Compass - using the parent portal on any modern web browser or using the 'Compass School Manager' app on your mobile device. Parents can enter full day absences, access student academic reports, school calendar and update contact numbers and email addresses via Compass.
