Dear parents

How are you all? These are tough times and as we have been stating all week in our communications. we're with you in spirit and ask you to call or email if you need to connect, talk or ask questions.

Communication

The best way to keep up with the messages and changes is to make sure you read all of the emails being sent home via Compass. These are also loaded onto the St Joseph's school website in the [Covid Online Info Hub](#). You can check back anytime in the hub for information.

Also take a look on FB for videos and tips. We will be communicating regularly on FB.

All teachers will communicate every day with students either by a zoom or an instructional video to help direct students with their learning from home. The teachers will inform you of this.

Students can ask questions of their teacher via Google classroom (years 3-6) or See saw (K-2). Teachers are also available to take enquiries from parents via email from 8.30-3pm daily.

School Attendance

I refer to a paragraph from the email sent yesterday:

*I understand that some parents need their child/ren to come to school, as they simply have no other option – we respect and support that. I also sympathise with the notion that children need some socialisation, however this is not a forever situation and we do need to get through this uncomfortable period in order to lift the lockdown. The NSW government has made it very clear school is open for supervision of those children whose families cannot do home learning – that means it is not for a place of socialisation. **I am also trying to protect the health of the staff at school by minimising contact as much as possible.** For those who have been able to tackle home learning, we know you're doing your best. And even if that 'best' looks and feels a bit lumpy and imperfect at times, that's OK. Some days will be easy. Some will be exhausting. This will all eventually pass if we can do the hard yards now.*

As the lockdown and home based learning is continuing for the next 2 weeks I would like to give our teaching staff the option to work from home on some days to reduce their person to person contact and to supervise their own families learning from home. To do this I need to know how many students will be at school each day. Students who attend will be supervised by a teacher at school to complete online learning in larger groups, not always in their own classroom.

To this end, I ask families who are sending their child/ren to complete [this google doc](#) as accurately as possible.

Events and cancellations

Of course, the lockdown has impacted heavily on our planned events for Term 3. At this stage we are either cancelling, trying to postpone or celebrating in a different way depending on the event.

I list some events below:

Athletics carnival

Unfortunately we have had to cancel the scheduled date for the Athletics carnival (Friday 23rd July). I am waiting for our CSBB head of sport to inform us of the decision from CSNSW about either postponing or cancelling the representative carnivals for 2021. This will impact on our decision about setting a new date for a carnival. I will keep you informed on this.

Grandparents Day Liturgy and Morning tea

Unfortunately this event is also cancelled in the format we had planned. Kath Fogwell is working on recording a liturgy and some extra video to share with the students in class and with all our grandparents all over the world when the students return to school full time.

Parent engagement Open classrooms- Enquiry Learning

This was scheduled for Tuesday 10th August. We are cancelling because even if the students are back at school we envisage that schools will be on Level 3 restrictions meaning no visitors to school or parent events on site.

Canteen

Obviously there is no canteen during lockdown. At this stage when students return to school, we envisage that it will be closed due to the level 3 restrictions of no parents/visitors onsite at school. We shall keep you informed of this.

ICAS Assessments – Optional Competition

This year we will once again give students from Years 2 to 6 the option of participating in the ICAS Assessments. ICAS is developed by UNSW Global, a wholly owned subsidiary of UNSW Sydney, with over 35 years' experience in educational assessments.

ICAS is designed to target students' higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills in various subjects. These assessments are a competition level of assessment, available to students of high ability in Years 2-6.

The assessments are suitable for students wishing to extend themselves academically and take up the personal challenge of competing in an international assessment. Your child will be presented with high-quality, expert-developed questions, allowing them to apply their learning without the need for prior study or revision. The assessments can be challenging, going beyond the expected year level, unlike NAPLAN assessments.

We will be emailing all families in Year 2 to 6 to give you the option of the **ICAS English and Mathematics assessments** for your child. ***You will need to sign up your child and pay for the assessment on the online links that will be provided for you. This will need to be done by 25 July 2021.***

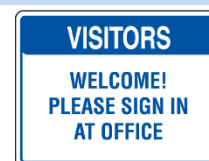
Contact information from the office

Compass Parent Portal

There are two ways to access Compass - using the parent portal on any modern web browser or using the 'Compass School Manager' app on your mobile device. Parents can enter full day absences, access student academic reports, school calendar and update contact numbers and email addresses via Compass.
