### Dear parents

Do you have Home Based Learning (**HBL**) fatigue? It's been 5 weeks and it certainly looks like we will have 5 more!

Last Friday evening you would have received an email from our Catholic Schools Broken Bay (**CSBB**) Director of schools, Danny Casey and our Bishop, Anthony Randazzo. The email was based on the Media Release from Catholic Schools NSW (**CSNSW**) re: the likelihood of the Greater Sydney lockdown extending to the end of term and therefore the readiness of Catholic schools to prepare for HBL to the end of this term (see letter at end of this newsletter).

So, on the back of that bleak news we have decided that next week will be whole school <u>wellbeing week</u> to give you a change in pace and a relief in mid term. What will that look like?

- there will be HBL learning Monday to Thursday for English, Maths and RE but less than usual
- the afternoon activities will be a selection of wellbeing tasks for students individually or for the whole family (see your class grid on Google classroom or See Saw as per usual)
- time to complete an entry for the St Joseph's first ever Bounce Fest, a creative and performing arts festival! This was announced on Thursday on FB but all the details can be <u>found here</u> on our webpage
- Friday will be an assessment and evaluation of HBL and prep day for staff (as endorsed by CSBB for all primary schools in our diocese).
  - There will be no HBL tasks set for Friday 20 August and staff will not be checking any online learning
- If your child must attend school on Friday 20 August they will be supervised with some play based activities indoors and outdoors.
- Friday could be a great opportunity for all families to take a break from the Home Based Learning (**HBL**) and look after your family well being if your work allows.

### Week 6 of HBL

Our staff supervision timetable this week, with just a skeleton staff at school each day, has been very effective in enabling teachers to plan and present some lessons for zoom or on video and connect more with the children learning from home. Thank you all for the work you are doing at home and supporting the teachers.

As per last week we would like you to fill in the Google form, (there is a new one for each week), to help us plan the supervision for the week.

**NEW GOOGLE FORM for week 6**. This is only for those families who due to work and family circumstances need to send their children to school on some days for supervision.

### P&F general meeting for Term 3 cancelled

You would have received an email from Sarah Reid and Amy Fittler, our P&F presidents re: the cancellation of this term's P&F meeting. Basically, there is nothing to report or organise at this stage and until we know the extent of future restrictions for returning to school we cannot plan anything.

The **uniform committee** was formed at the Term 2 P&F meeting and has met during Term 2 with the rep from Cowan and Lewis re: an updated uniform for girls in 2022. We will meet on Monday night to finalise plans for introducing that uniform. We will inform you of this very soon.

### Awareness of Covid identified venues and testing

We ask that you stay aware of the identified venues as casual or close contact near to us in terms of requirements by the govt for testing. Woolworths Narrabeen was identified last Sunday night as a casual contact venue for those who attended on Sunday 1 and Monday 2 August. This affected 3 of our staff who all had to be tested and stay at home until a negative test received. If your child requires a test or has symptoms and needs a test please inform us and show proof of the negative result if they are coming to school. This is to protect the staff and students who are at school and their families. Unfortunately, children are not immune or safe from this strain of the virus, as we see from the schools being shut down after positive cases.

### **TERM 3 - HBL**

#### **Communication**

We will continue to keep you informed by our usual channels of communication. The best way to keep up with the messages and changes is to make sure you read all of the emails being sent home via Compass. These are also loaded onto the St Joseph's school website in the <a href="Covid online Info Hub">Covid online Info Hub</a>. You can check back anytime in the hub for information. Here's a quick summary of where to go for key information during Home Learning.

- **COMPASS**: We send official school emails via the Compass app. These will also be updated on the Online Info Hub.
- **SCHOOL WEBSITE**: We have two key pages:

- **EMAIL**: Teachers will email parents directly with news specific to students and classes. (Including login details and passwords if you need them.) Teachers are available on email from 8.30am-3.30pm.
- **SEESAW**: Kindergarten to Year 2 will use Seesaw to allow communication between students and teachers, and to allow students to complete and submit work within the app.
- **GOOGLE CLASSROOM**: Years 3-6 will use Google Classroom to communicate directly between students and teachers, and to allow students to complete and submit work.

### **Supervision at School**

We currently have a skeleton staff working at school. Thank you all for the work you are doing at home and supporting the teachers.

We set up a new Google form attendance each week, communicated to families via Compass and the newsletter. This is only for those families who due to work and family circumstances need to send their children to school on some days for supervision.

### **School Buses during August Lockdown**

Please note there will be **NO SCHOOL BUSES** operating to our school (morning and afternoon) during the August lockdown period (2 August through to end of August).

### Sick / Absence during HBL

During the HBL period, all children are marked "present" for home based learning.

If your child is sick for a day and not completing any HBL work, please mark them as absent/sick in Compass, just like you would for a normal school day.

Parents can enter full day absences, access student academic reports, school calendar and update contact numbers and email addresses via Compass. Dear Parents and Carers,

### **Assisting families during COVID**

Catholic schools across Australia will celebrate Family Week from 8-14 August. This annual event recognises the tremendous support that parents, carers, and families provide in choosing a Catholic education for their children. Now, more than ever, this COVID pandemic has highlighted the importance of working in partnership with families to ensure continuity of learning and formation for our students.

Recent weeks have been an unpredictable and anxious time for our staff, students and families and we would like to thank you for your patience and support as we navigate through the constantly changing landscape of COVID. We can only imagine the challenges you are facing and stress the critical role parents and carers play in supporting your children's learning.

Thank you to all the parents who have provided feedback, expressed their appreciation for the hard work of our teachers or shared their concerns. We are happy to have been able to support those that have needed to send children to school, entrusting us with the care of your children. Equally we have supported the families that have managed home-based learning and its unique challenges. We express our sincere thanks to you all.

Earlier today, CSNSW issued a statement *Safety, Certainty and Learning* for Term 3 and 4 in NSW Catholic Schools. With regard to Health and Government advice, the following guidelines detail the approach Catholic Schools Broken Bay will adopt for the balance of term 3 and term 4.

### **HSC Students**

- Year 12 students will not return for onsite learning in Term 3 until it is safe for all students, however schools will remain open for students who need to be there.
- All year 12 students will participate in Home-Based Learning until the end of term 3. In place of the HSC Trial Examinations, schools use alternative assessment tasks. Your school Principal will provide details particular to your school.

### Kindergarten to Year 11 Students

- We are anticipating, expecting and preparing for the very real possibility that all students will be required to continue in Home-Based Learning for the remainder of term 3.
- Consistent with health advice, families should keep children at home to reduce mobility around our communities. Schools will remain open for children that need to attend.

- It is our hope that students will return to onsite learning in term 4. This, of course, is dependent on advice from Government, with the safety of all students and staff being our key concern.
- Further updates will be provided by your school Principal.

### Extra Support for Teaching and Learning: HBL+

We are conscious that HBL has continued for far longer than initially anticipated and no clear end date is yet in sight. We are well aware of the demands that places on our students and our staff. We are delivering a new initiative HBL+, to enhance teaching and learning and to support the wellbeing of families across our system. This program will respond to the issues raised by parents and staff in their local context. For example, schools will have access to resources created for use across our System and some that have been created especially for their local community.

The wellbeing of our students, families and staff remains our primary concern. As a community of faith, we encourage you to stay connected with other families within your school community and support each other through this difficult period. If you are feeling overwhelmed and require additional support, please reach out to your school principal, school counsellor or School/Parish Priest for assistance. <a href="CatholicCare">CatholicCare</a>, the social care and support agency of the Catholic Church in the Diocese of Broken Bay, is also available to assist during this challenging time.

<u>Broken Bay Catholic Schools Parents</u> is a wonderful resource that represents our families as a group, who have been advocating on your behalf and keeping us connected during COVID. Representatives of this group are parents and families from your school, and they are available to hear your feedback and provide help.
