They are both stepping down from the role and have been brilliant in the very seamless smooth running of the canteen. Thanks also to all the parent volunteers in the canteen for committing when we were open. Thanks to Naomi for looking after second-hand uniforms and being on call for that time. Naomi too is leaving our community and I'd like to thank her for her commitment to various voluntary roles over the years. Thanks to Amy and Kelly Casey for administering the school banking each Tuesday. School banking has now ceased across the nation.

Thanks also to the class parents of each class. Although there were only a few events on, they played the role of information disseminators when that was so needed. I very much appreciate your commitment to the role. I look forward to 2022 hopefully being a 'more normal' year where our community can gather more.

Last day of school this year

To those families that have been enquiring, the last day of school for students is **Wednesday 15 December.** As per our usual practice we will have an end of year liturgy and farewell at 11.30 am (in the playground). **Children may be collected after that** (about 12.45/1pm) after we have our traditional 'clap out' of the Year 6 class.

Afternoon pick up and use of church driveway

At this stage there is no indication that restrictions will ease before the end of the year in terms of allowing parents on site for pick up and drop off. This means that we must stick with the processes we have in place now. We have made the earlier pick up time for Kinder to Year 2 so that there is less congestion of parents on the street to meet the regulations set by Department of Health for schools.

Pick up time for parents of children in Kinder to Year 2 ONLY at 2.50 pm. This includes at kiss n ride. **Do not wait at kiss n ride before 3.05pm if you are picking up older children too.** It is dangerous as cars that are stationary in the zone means that those actually picking up the younger children only have one spot on the corner left. For the sake of the safety of all our children and parents we ask that you do the right thing.

If you are using the Church driveway please enter via Waterloo St and park on the left at the poles to allow others to get through. PLEASE BE CAREFUL entering and exiting the church driveway as many families walk through there.

Uniform - exciting changes are here! Please read the note about boys shirts

After many years, we are changing the St Joseph's uniform to a more modern, inclusive, cost-effective and climate friendly option. This was done after much consideration and consultation with the uniform committee and our uniform supplier, Cowan and Lewis. Clarification: The current girls summer dress will become 'old' uniform from Term 2 2022, when the new girl's blouse will be available. It still appears on the information from Cowan and Lewis. They do have some limited stock if you want to purchase one for Term 1 2022 (it could be worn until your daughter grows out of it).

**Boys shirt: the sizing of the boys shirt is more generous than the Lowes shirt (this is common between different manufacturers). If you find your child has been in a size 10 Lowes shirt and now needs a bigger size, the size 12 may be very roomy. It's easy to exchange through school if you find the size isn't right

iPads for Learning | BYODD for 2022 | Years 4, 5 & 6 2022

Since 2020 we have had a Bring Your Own Designated Device (**BYODD**) program for students in Years 4-6 for iPads. This is optional for families. As students move up in the grades they access the iPads in a greater variety of ways across many subject areas. When they have their own device they can store their work and creations on it and have access when they need it instead of sharing a device across the class. The CSBB is also encouraging this program as most other devices in school will now be on lease agreements. Leasing is far more cost effective for the Diocese. This also frees up the leased devices for the younger grades.

School Buses - Student Opal Card

Message from Transport NSW – School Bus Opal Cards

Applications for student travel in 2022 opened on **Tuesday 12 October 2021**. Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2022 can <u>apply</u> now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for a school travel pass for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (eg joint custody).



Students who change address, school, campus location, or who have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should <u>renew or update</u> their details before **the end of term 4**. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications and current entitlements are updated and remain valid. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new <u>eligibility criteria</u>, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2022.

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney) or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year.

From 1 November 2021, the bus service provider in the Northern Beaches area will change from State Transit Authority (Sydney Buses) to **Keolis Downer Northern Beaches**. Students, parents or carers applying for a School Opal card will need to nominate **Keolis Downer Northern Beaches** as their bus operator.

Students with an existing School Opal card will automatically have Keolis Downer Northern Beaches added to their travel entitlement. If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out via transportnsw.info/contact-us/feedback/fares-concessions-tickets-feedback

Compass Parent Portal

There are two ways to access Compass - using the parent portal on any modern web browser or using the 'Compass School Manager' app on your mobile device. Parents can enter full day absences, access student academic reports, school calendar and update contact numbers and email addresses via Compass. All parents have their own individual login details (emailed direct to you from the CSO). Parent guides can be found on the Compass Parent Portal page of our website here.


