Dear parents

RAT tests for weeks 4 and 5 distributed yesterday.

You would have received a message on Compass yesterday that your child brought home a box of RATs. There are 5 tests in the box. 2 for next week (week 4), 2 for week 5 and 1 spare. Please check your child's bag. All Covid information, including links to the NSW govt site with information for schools is on our website. Use the link helow:

If your child has to stay at home as a close contact you can access the NESA digital learning modules appropriate to their grade for "self-paced learning" at home. Your child's teacher will be in contact with you via email if this is the case - https://education.nsw.gov.au/teaching-and-learning/learning-from-home/learning-at-home

In brief:

• all students need to be tested on Monday and Wednesday before attending school (this could be the night before at bedtime if easier for your family). Use the RAT provided by school. See insert below from govt site:

For the first 4 weeks of Term 1, we recommend students take a RAT twice a week on mornings before attending school.

- o If your child has even mild COVID-19 symptoms, get them tested with a RAT or PCR (nose and throat swab) test.
- o They must isolate until they receive a negative test result, in line with health protocols.
- o If symptoms continue, they should stay at home and take another RAT in 24 hours or have a PCR test. If the second RAT or initial PCR test result is negative, or another diagnosis is confirmed such as hay fever, they can return to school.
- please do not send your child to school if they are feeling unwell. Children who are unwell will be brought to the school sick bay and parents contacted to collect them;
- If your child has had Covid there is some particular advice on the govt site:
 - It is recommended that staff and students that return to school after recovering from COVID-19 do not participate in rapid antigen test surveillance for 28 days (four weeks after recovery) following release from self-isolation. This is due to NSW Health advice that people who have recovered from COVID-19 have a low risk of contracting it again in the following 28 days. After 28 days (from week five after recovery) staff and students may resume participation in RAT surveillance.
- no visitors to the school site until further notice from the govt. There are some exceptions to this which we will inform you if needed;
- thank you for adhering to the drop off and afternoon pick up procedures from last year. Please remember if
 your child is in Year 3-6 they will not be dismissed until 3.05pm. Please do not wait in the drive by pick up
 zone before this time if you have older children;

• some school events can be conducted in a covid safe way (swimming carnival, beginning of year Mass, parent/teacher information evening).

Swimming Carnival - Monday 7 February

It was so exciting to hold a whole school event again! Although we couldn't allow parent spectators the children really enjoyed the afternoon, even with a few rain squalls. My thanks to those parents who volunteered as helpers, you are very much appreciated, especially those who jumped in the pool as lifeguards for the 25m races.

Tomorrow morning, we will announce the winning colour house and the Spirit Cup award. Special mention of the Year 6 class who participated in very high numbers and set the tone for a very positive carnival. Children who have advanced to the Northern Beaches Catholic schools carnival on Monday7 March will be informed by our PE teacher Nikki Frost and will bring home a note with details of this event. A video of the highlights and announcement of winners will be loaded up on FB and on our school webpage tomorrow by Lu.

Combined P&F and class parents meeting - Monday 7 Feb 7pm (via zoom)

On Monday night this week we had a very well attended P&F and class parents meeting via Zoom. The P&F exec put forward the events we hope to hold for the year. Each class parent is nominating the event they'd like to organise, and the P&F exec will allocate. Due to restrictions with Covid these first weeks and the uncertainty of what restrictions will look like for the rest of the term the decision has been made that we will not hold the usual Term 1 'welcome to school' function. This is in line with advice from CSNSW regarding in school events. Instead, classes can organise their own social event out of school at a suitable outdoor venue if you wish. The only P&F event for Term 1 will be the Easter raffle at the end of term.

The big fundraisers for this year will be a colour fun run for the students on 21 October and the hugely popular trivia night for parents. (date TBA).

Fingers crossed we will be able to conduct all our planned events this year, even with some restrictions.

Attendees at the meeting were able to give some feedback on the new uniform and the uniform committee will be meeting to discuss this. Julia Lamb, a new kinder mum, volunteered to co-ordinate the 2nd hand uniform shop. More on that when Julia is up to speed on it all.

Debbie Carter who has volunteered to manage the ordering and co-ordination of canteen this year has met with me this week and is hoping to have the canteen ready to open on Monday 21 February. Parent engagement in 2022 - Open classrooms each term

Last year as part of our strategy for our School Improvement Plan (SIP), we continued an open classroom session in Terms 1 (English) and Term 2 (Maths) Covid restrictions and lock downs in Terms 3 &4 meant we could not continue. This year we are trying again! Each term will be a different subject, day and time to try and cater for many parents over the year.

Canteen Roster & News


The canteen will be open for <u>LUNCH ORDERS ONLY</u> this term. There will not be any over-the-counter service at recess/lunchtime. See roster below, if you are able to volunteer, please email Nichole Gleadow at: nicolegleadow@gmail.com

All canteen volunteers must be fully vaccinated.

Days shaded red will open once we have the required number of volunteers. We require two volunteers to open canteen, with one being an experienced volunteer.

Clarification of canteen operation and Qkr ordering

- The canteen is open Mondays and Fridays provided we have volunteers.
- Any student who wishes to buy <u>lunch</u> from the canteen needs to have a Qkr lunch order placed.
- Lunch orders can be submitted on Qkr two weeks in advance.
- Please avoid trying to order "on the morning" as Qkr gets very busy and you may not be able to process your order.
- Please take note of the date you select for "order delivery". There is a two week period on the screen to choose from.
- On dates where we do not have volunteers, you cannot "accidentally" place a Qkr order. The system is closed off.
- Please check the newsletter weekly to see when the canteen is open.
- Volunteers must sign-in at the school office prior to working in the canteen.

Compass Parent Portal

There are two ways to access Compass - using the parent portal on any modern web browser or using the 'Compass School Manager' app on your mobile device. Parents can enter full day absences, access student academic reports, school calendar and update contact numbers and email addresses via Compass. All parents have their own individual login details (emailed direct to you from the CSO). Parent guides can be found on the Compass Parent Portal page of our website here.

WHOLE DAY ABSENCE Enter via the APP on your phone (sick, holiday) – you do not need to change the times, the default of "8am to 5pm" covers the school day. Absences of 10 or more days - Request for Leave form must be submitted to the office as well as entering via APP
