The Latest on RATs

Schools will now align with the community and do 'symptomatic testing'. RAT Kits were sent home in students bags yesterday, 1 box each.

Students and staff can use their allocation of RATs at their discretion, such as if they are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms.

If a student has even mild COVID-19 symptoms, they must get tested with a RAT or PCR (nose and throat swab) test.

They must isolate until they receive a negative test result, in line with health protocols.

Learning at Home

If your child has to stay at home as a close contact you can access the NESA digital learning modules appropriate to their grade for 'self paced learning' at home. Your child's teacher will be in contact with you via email if this is the case. <u>More info can be found here.</u>
