Current changes to Covid regulations at schools

It's been wonderful to have parents back on the grounds for pick up in the afternoon. Please stay on the basketball court to the half way line so we can release children in an orderly way.

Thank you to those parents who have continued to drop their child at the gate in the morning, this is working really well in terms of safety for playing and building independent skills for students.

Information from CSNSW - From Monday 7 March:

Masks no longer mandatory for staff in primary schools: masks will no longer be mandatory for staff in primary schools as of Monday 7 March. This staggered change recognises the lower vaccination rates in primary school aged students.

RAT surveillance

Schools will now align with community settings of 'symptomatic testing'. More RAT Kits will be delivered to families (possibly next week when the CSBB informs me). Students and staff can use their allocation of RATs at their discretion, such as if they are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms.

- If a student has even mild COVID-19 symptoms, they must get tested with a RAT or PCR (nose and throat swab) test.
- They must isolate until they receive a negative test result, in line with health protocols.

If symptoms continue, they should stay at home and take another RAT in 24 hours or have a PCR test. If the second RAT or initial PCR test result is negative, or another confirmed diagnosis, such as hay fever, they can return to school.

Stage 3 camp

What a bunch of positive troopers our Years 5&6 students are!

Despite the forecast 'weather event' they attended the Leadership camp at the Collaroy Centre yesterday and today, staying overnight. When I visited yesterday evening they had completed all their outdoor activities for the day and were in dry clothes ready for dinner with smiles on their faces and full of exciting stories about the laser challenge, the flying fox, high ropes challenge and archery.

Parent engagement in 2022 - Open classroom

Our parent engagement session for Term 1 is on **Monday 14 March 14** and the subject focus is **Enquiry units** (this could be Science &Tech, History or Geography depending on the class focus unit for this term). You will be welcome to visit your child's class and join in the learning. There are staggered times to allow for parents to get to classes.

K-2 classes: 2-2.30pm

3-6 classes: 2.15-2.45pm

The purpose of these open classroom sessions comes from a strategy in our School Improvement Plan (**SIP**) to increase the engagement levels of learning for students and parents. By visiting your child's room, you can have some insight into the learning of that subject and lead to open discussions with your child about their learning, therefore increasing your engagement levels.

Remember it is a privilege to be invited into a classroom in action, please respect the teacher by not talking when they are giving whole class instructions and please respect the privacy of other students by not looking through their books. What you will be seeing is not a complete lesson, it is part of a sequence of lessons and tasks to lead to achievement of outcomes. Teachers will try to adapt the learning so that you can participate with your child. We look forward to welcoming you in.

Safety issue at kiss n drop before and after school

A reminder that the kiss n drop zone outside the school is not a place to park and then walk your child to the gate. This causes congestion for other cars waiting to drop off children. If your child needs escorting, please park elsewhere and walk them to the gate. In the afternoon there are only 3 allocated places for cars to line up. If it is full please do not block off the corner, go around the block and try again. This may take time but it is about the safety of ALL of the children. Be aware the ranger does visit us on occasion to check we are keeping to the rules of the road. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter.

NAPLAN 2022 for years 3&5 - Date claimer

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (**NAPLAN**) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual tests in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. All NSW schools will sit NAPLAN online in 2022.

Our school will be participating in NAPLAN between 10 and 13 May 2022.

Ash Wednesday – 2 March 2022

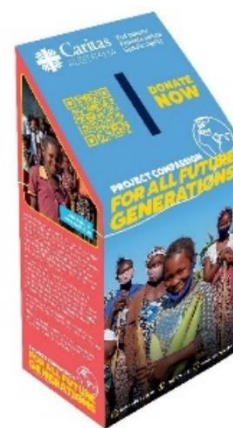

Clarification of canteen operation and Qkr ordering

- The canteen is open Mondays and Fridays **provided we have volunteers.**
- Any student who wishes to buy **lunch** from the canteen needs to have a Qkr lunch order placed.
- Lunch orders can be submitted on Qkr **two weeks in advance.**
- Please avoid trying to order "on the morning" as Qkr gets very busy and you may not be able to process your order.
- Please take note of the date you select for "**order delivery**". There is a two week period on the screen to choose from.
- On dates where we do not have volunteers, you cannot "accidentally" place a Qkr order. The system is closed off.
- Please check the newsletter weekly to see when the canteen is open.
- **Volunteers must sign-in at the school office prior to working in the canteen.**



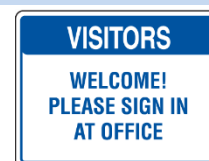

Parent Volunteers

Compass Parent Portal

There are two ways to access Compass - using the parent portal on any modern web browser or using the 'Compass School Manager' app on your mobile device. Parents can enter full day absences, access student academic reports, school calendar and update contact numbers and email addresses via Compass. All parents have their own individual login details (emailed direct to you from the CSO). Parent guides can be found on the Compass Parent Portal page of our website [here](#).

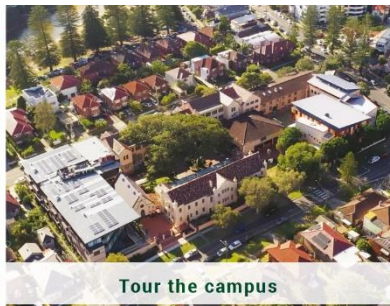
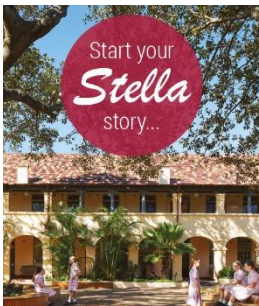
