RAT surveillance

Schools will now align with community settings of 'symptomatic testing'. RAT Kits were sent home in students bags yesterday, 1 box per student.

Students and staff can use their allocation of RATs at their discretion, such as if they are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms.

- If a student has even mild COVID-19 symptoms, they must get tested with a RAT or PCR (nose and throat swab) test.
- They must isolate until they receive a negative test result, in line with health protocols.
