


Repairs and Maintenance

Catholic Schools Broken Bay have embarked on a large scale repairs and maintenance project in all our schools across the Diocese. There are six main items which will form part of the scope for this project including; carpet replacement, painting, gutter/downpipes repairs, replacement of window coverings, review of electrical compliance and replacement of wet areas. Our school will have some of these items completed as identified by an audit. Works will likely commence next week or the week after and be completed by September 30. There will be some changes to classes. This may mean a class moving to a temporary learning space for 2–5 days, depending on the scheduled work in the room. As part of this project, there is a project partner from the CSBB and the buildings project manager who will inform me and I will be keeping our community informed of progress of the work. 

Communication with School & Teachers

Last week we shared links to our updated <u>Sustainable</u> <u>Relationships Policy</u>, with an added appendix about communication. The communication section from the <u>Parent Handbook</u> has a section about emailing teachers, which is copied here for ease:

To arrange a meeting to discuss particular concerns: While smaller concerns can often be dealt with over email, bigger challenges linked to social, emotional, or behavioural concerns are best talked about in a meeting and your child's teacher is available for this. Please email a brief outline of your concerns to your child's teacher and arrange a face—to—face or Zoom meeting to ensure there is enough time and focus to address the matter thoroughly and work towards a positive outcome.

Please ensure your child knows pick-up arrangements before they come to school each morning. This helps them to feel settled and at ease during their school day. Please communicate any unforeseen changes of pick up arrangements directly with the office.

Please also note our policy on students' use of smart watches which states that these are to be used outside school hours only.



Please note that it is extremely difficult for teachers to check and respond to email during the day due to teaching, playground and other responsibilities. A call to the office is the most reliable way to communicate an urgent message.

Teachers will respond to email within 2 working days, between the hours of 8am and 5pm.
