

Time for us Joeys to rally!



Looking Ahead



MAI Bookings: Open Monday

You can book your child in for their MAI for 2023 from Monday, via the Compass app. What is MAI and why is it important? In the Diocese of Broken Bay, every primary school conducts the Mathematics Assessment Interview (MAI) annually at the start of the year. This is a one-on-one assessment conducted by the class teacher in interview format to determine a child's level in the number strands in maths and to measure the growth each year.

The Mathematics Assessment Interview and associated Growth Point Framework is a highly innovative form of assessment that is based on extensive research conducted during the Early Numeracy Research Project. The MAI is taskbased, interactive, designed for young children, and enables progress to be measured in mathematical domains against a research-based framework of growth points.

There are four whole number domains; Counting, Place Value, Strategies for Addition and Subtraction, and Strategies for Multiplication and Division.

A critical role for the teacher throughout the interview is to listen and observe the children as they engage with a task, noting their responses, strategies and explanations. These observations are recorded on a detailed record sheet and then analysed to determine whether or not a response was correct; to identify the strategy used to complete a task; and to determine the growth point reached by a child overall in each domain. This growth point information can be further analysed at a student, class or school level in order to plan and develop curriculum and instruction, and to measure student progress over time.'

It is very important that you book a time with the teacher for next year and then keep that appointment. The results of the assessment are analysed, and each teacher plans the maths program accordingly.

NB Council Traffic Audit Results

This audit was conducted last term – thanks for your feedback about our Kiss N Ride zone and surrounding streets. At the P&F meeting I shared some of the results, which included answers to queries on the survey. The council will consult with us and the community in February on a new plan to change our kiss and ride zone to Ocean St! Stay tuned for more info.
