Hair Guidelines

The reason we have guidelines around hair includes head lice prevention and also practicality. When a student is learning and puts their head down, their hair can be distracting and irritating as it falls in their face. For both girls and boys, long hair should be tied back. (The school is not opposed to long hair for boys but it must be tied up and out of the eyes, the same expectation we have for girls.) Otherwise, boy's hair should be neat and not in an extreme style such as cutting in or shaving to the scalp. Chemical colouring is not permitted. Hair ribbons must be in the school colours. Please ensure if your child's hair needs attention, they come to school with it neat and tidy by Monday. Thanks for your co-operation.

Mobile Device Policy

Our parent handbook (<u>linked here</u>) has our policy around mobile phones and personal devices (such as smart watches). It's timely to revisit this at the start of the year.

"Children should not have mobile phones at school. If there is a reason why a child needs a mobile phone, a letter explaining the reasons ought to be directed to the Principal who will make a determination to vary the policy in each case. Mobile phones are to be left in school bags or on the teacher's desk during the day and not accessed by the student. The school accepts no liability for mobile phones that have been granted permission to be at school.

Many primary and high schools (including Mater Maria) now have a school rule that mobile phones and devices are left in bags. This enables students to focus on learning and socialising face-to-face. At primary schools, there is no reason why students would need to contact parents, we can make that contact if needed. In recent years there has also been the addition of personal smart wristwatches that can be used to communicate or play games and the same rationale applies. If your child needs to bring a mobile phone to school or wear their wristwatch to be able to communicate with you after school we request that it is set to 'school mode' between the hours of 9-3pm.
