# Safety around School

## **Road Safety Guidelines**

It is timely at the start of the year to remind parents and students about road safety as it relates to travelling to and from school. We have a Road Safety Guidelines document that has just been reviewed and updated, <u>found on our website here.</u> I encourage you to read this document and speak with your child if applicable.

Last year, the NB Council conducted a traffic audit for our school. We have received some communication from them this week re: the proposal to move the Kiss n Drop/Ride zone.

"We are still planning to move the Kiss and Drop zone to Ocean Street. This requires community consultation and then review by the Local Traffic Committee before we can confirm that it will go ahead, and what exactly it will look like. I'll show you this design before we go public to confirm you are in agreement with our plans. I'll be in touch again about this once I have a design I can show you."

Meanwhile, this week, our FB page has reminded us all about the safe use of the Kiss n Ride zone. Please adhere to the rules for the convenience and safety for all students. This area is a No Parking zone at school drop off and pick up hours.

The council also informed us about changing the bus zone in Lagoon St. They will be changing it to being a bus zone only at school drop off and pick up times, to allow for school buses.

All these changes and ideas have safety at the core. Joeys students are also taught road safety throughout the year, and have one-off lessons about specific challenges. From time to time myself, or other teachers will speak with groups of students about being safe around travelling to and from school. Yesterday, I spoke with children who ride their bikes to school about safety and sharing the pavement, especially at the shops in Waterloo St. Last week I spoke to a group of children about going to Woolies before or after school and being careful and respectful. Of course, students should only be at the shops with your permission and conduct themselves in an orderly and well-mannered way. Thanks for your support!
