## Safety Reminders - Play Equipment

We don't want to be the playground grinch, but as our playground is on school grounds, we need teacher supervision when children are playing on it. That means we need to respectfully ask you don't let younger siblings play on the equipment before or after school. Thanks for your understanding.

## Kiss n Ride Etiquette

We'd like to gently remind you of some Kiss n Ride tips, with the focus always being on safety first. We only have three spots and want to ensure the process is as smooth as possible for everyone. Thank you for your support!

- Please never park in Kiss n Ride to walk your Joey in. If they're unexpectedly distressed, please pop them safely back in your vehicle, park in a suitable spot and walk in.
- Please only exit the vehicle if you have to (IE to help your child safely load or unload.). If you need to leave your car, please stay within 5m of the car and keep things as quick as safely possible.
- There is no teacher to assist in the morning. Our teachers will bring your child to your vehicle in the afternoon, and it helps if you have your name displayed in the window. (If you need a sign, you can ask Kerrie in the office.)
- Please only use one of the spots available. If you don't fit in the allocated spot, do a lap of the block. Don't queue in Wellington Street.
- It helps to remember that Kiss n Ride clears REALLY quickly outside of peak times. In the afternoon, it's very busy between 3pm and 3.10 and completely empty by 3.11pm! Try arriving a few mins after 3.05pm to stagger traffic.
- Please don't honk or shout at other parents. It will only upset everyone and respect is a key value of our community.
- Don't swoop in to an empty spot in front if one pops up and you're driving past. We have seen some nasty accidents happen this way, as the 'behind' vehicle may be moving up into the gap or also exiting. Just take the extra minute to do a lap.
- If it's really busy, and you can, try parking nearby and walking up it can often be even quicker.

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# Road Safety

## From Northern Beaches Council

### Bus flashing lights:

Lights flash on buses to warn motorists that buses are picking up and dropping off children. Drivers must slow down to 40 km/h when overtaking or passing a bus displaying flashing lights, unless a lower speed applies.

### Motorists can help keep children safe by:

- Slowing down to 40km/h when bus lights are flashing, unless a lower speed limit applies
- · Looking out for children crossing the road near bus stops, in school zones or along bus routes
- Giving way to buses when they merge back into traffic.

### Reminder for parents and families:

School-aged children might seem independent, but they still need a hand. Remember:

• Always meet your child at school or the bus stop. Never wait on the opposite side of the road and call them across.

• Always supervise your child and hold their hand when walking to and from the bus stop/interchange and when crossing the road until they're at least 10 years old.

• Wait until the bus has gone then use a safe place to cross the road.

# Talk to your children about using Stop! Look! Listen! Think! every time they cross the road:

- $\cdot$  Stop one step back from the kerb
- · Look continuously both ways
- · Listen for the sounds of approaching traffic.
- Think whether is safe to cross and keep checking until safely across.
