Dear parents,

It's been a very sad week here for the staff as we come to terms with the sudden passing of Brenda Paul's husband Tony, last Friday afternoon. Brenda obviously is still in shock and trying to deal with the trauma and loss. She will be on leave for the rest of Term 2. Kath Fogwell will be acting Assistant Principal in this time with her days off class covered by Kath McCamey. Sam Carolan will be in the Library on Tuesdays and Thursdays to cover this position. The funeral is next Thursday at 1pm. Brenda has requested that the students do not attend, she is so appreciative of your support and loving messages, but the venue is not a suitable place for a lot of children.

As you would understand, most of the staff would like to attend the funeral to be with Brenda. Our neighbouring Catholic schools are rallying around to 'lend' us some staff from 12pm to supervise the students. However, to help with this we invite you to collect your children at 12pm that day (only if you can) so that we can organise the supervision with a skeleton staff. Of course, the school is still open from 12pm if you cannot collect your children and OOSH will be open that afternoon as per usual.

If you can inform your class teacher if you intend to collect your child at 12pm, that will help us to organise numbers. There will be NO usual fortnightly school assembly that Thursday afternoon. Thanks for your understanding.

This week has also seen an increase in absenteeism amongst children and staff with the dreaded flu or Covid. Please monitor your children and keep them at home if they are unwell, to keep us all as healthy as we can be.

The attendees at the meeting were keen to trial it. We really appreciate the volunteer roles that Debbie and Nicole take on, along with all our amazing volunteers every week, which keep our canteen functioning as a community service. Friendology: Parent Tip

Encouraging your child to stand up for themselves: When our child talks to us about her friendship problems, our default response can be to say to the things that were said to us. "Just ignore them", "Walk away", "They're just jealous" are the kinds of phrases that instantly spring to mind. But these responses can be too passive and minimising. Instead, take some time to listen and empathise, and then follow up by asking "Did you stand up for yourself?"

Rather than retreating, we should encourage our kids to confront their problems and not simply put up with bad behaviour. Ask kids what they could do differently next time and role play different scenarios, so they feel practised and more confident.


