

What's It All About?

Wouldn't it be great to have a common language and dialogue across St Joseph's that is simple but meaningful and supports your child and their friends in building healthy friendships with each other? Do you often find yourself at a loss for advice when your child comes to you with friendship issues? What advice do you give? How do you help empower your child?

This term, St Joseph's is excited to be launching a new and innovative program called <u>URSTRONG</u> (find out more via the linked text). This program is a school-wide approach and is all about empowering your children with friendship skills! This is a proven, skills-based strategy that teaches kid-friendly concepts, skills and language to help build and maintain healthy friendships.

URSTRONG provides our students (and the adults in their lives – both parents and teachers), with a common language to support them. Relationships are the heart of social-emotional wellbeing, and we want to make our school into a community of kindness!

We will become a URSTRONG school and teach Friendology 101 lessons throughout the year. The students are considered to be 'Friendship Ninjas' when they utilise their friendship skills. Throughout this Term, we will share info for families with tips to talk about and reinforce what is happening at school. Parents play a crucial role in helping to build these friendship skills in their children.

We will be launching URSTRONG and the Friendology 101 Program with 'A Day of Friendship' next Tuesday May 7th. We will focus on the colour green as this represents the healthy Friendology colour symbol. Students are invited to wear green-themed mufti next Tuesday. Each class will participate in activities and lessons to introduce the program.

We will be holding a Parent Engagement Session in Week 8 on the June 20th in the afternoon, to give you an insight into the program.

The posters on the next few pages are used as visual aids to help students learn the skills. They will be displayed in classrooms around the school from next week, so keep an eye out for them. Thank you for your support!

THE FRIEND-O-CYCLE

Demonstrates the normal cycle in a healthy friendship. Children learn, step-by-step, how to Talk-it-Out to put our their Friendship Fires and move towards Forgive & Forget.
