Dear Parents and Carers

In response to New South Wales curriculum reform, Catholic Schools Broken Bay has reviewed student reporting processes. This review aims to align reporting with updated outcomes in NSW Syllabuses and promote consistency within and across schools.

Recognising the importance of working in partnership with parents and carers, CSBB reporting practices include:

- providing written reports that inform parents and carers about their child's learning progress.
- providing opportunities to engage with parents and carers about their child's learning.


Reporting of student achievement is a legislative requirement. Schools are required to use the A to E Common Grade scale which summarises the standard of achievement for each grade, indicating the depth of knowledge, understanding, and skills expected from students at that level. A standards-referenced approach promotes consistency and clarity in assessing and reporting student learning against the agreed set of standards. Evaluating each student's progress against these standards, allows for transparent and consistent feedback to both students and their families. You can find the A-E grade scale here (and further below in this newsletter).

This semester, your child's written report will reflect learning from the first two terms. Grades are allocated based on student achievement of the learning in which they have participated during Term 1 and 2.

Teachers use quality assessment data and their own observations to make professional judgments regarding student achievement against the state-wide syllabus standards, focusing on specific outcomes and content outlined in the syllabus.

Reports will be sent home via Compass on Friday June 21st.

Friendology: Parent Tip - Bullying

There's a lot of talk about bullies and bullying at the moment. But our advice is to avoid the word altogether. The reason is that it's often misused and leads children — and their parents – to label kids. Instead, use the term "mean-on-purpose". Children understand what this means and know when someone is intentionally trying to hurt them.

Parents can help their kids come up with a quick comeback statement to combat mean-on-purpose behaviour. A simple "Not cool", "Wow" or "That was really mean" will suffice.

Quick comeback statements should be delivered in a strong voice with authoritative body language, and then the child should walk away. If they've tried using a quick comeback and the person continues to be mean-on- purpose, that's when an adult needs to get involved. It's the respondibility of the adults (parents and teachers) to ensure that children feel safe and supported.

Vinnies Winter Appeal




The St Vincent de Paul Society has launched its 2024 Vinnies Winter Appeal. Your children will be coming home with a note about this today.

Years 5 & 6 STEM Design Project

Years 5 and 6 have been working on Level 2 STEM Design Processes this term (developing the thinking and skills needed to complete design processes). On Monday June 24th, they will set up a special ideas fair for their parents to come and check out what they have been working on. Other classes will also take a look at their work and no doubt be inspired!

Each STEM team will show their 'NRMA Future of Transport' solution, which is their idea on how to tackle a transport problem facing our community. In 'science fair' style, parents can check out the range of ideas and ask questions to see how they reached their possible solution. A few teams will then be chosen to enter the broader 'NRMA Future of Transport' competition, where they will pitch their idea.





The A-E Common Grade Scale

From the National Education Standards Authority

Further to Mrs Outred's Principal's message at the top of the newsletter, this explains the A-E Common Grade Scale, used in our school reporting. Your child's report will be available on Friday June 21st.

This allows consistency in results from Primary school, right through to High School. The same standard is used across all NSW school systems.

The Common Grade Scale shown below can be used to report student achievement in both primary and junior secondary years in all NSW schools.

The Common Grade Scale describes performance at each of five grade levels.

The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.

The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.

The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.

The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a limited level of competence in the processes and skills.

The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.
