# Kindergarten TERM 3 CURRICULUM NOTE

### **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**

Catholic Schools Broken Bay use a student-centred approach for K-2 Religious Education that has a focus on early years pedagogy. It uses rich hands-on resources to explore deep connections and continue to build each child's journey of faith.

#### **MATHEMATICS**

. In mathematics K-2, students:

- develop essential numeracy skills and mathematical fluency
- identify, describe and apply patterns and relationships
- develop their reasoning and problem-solving skills
- apply their knowledge and understanding in practical situations and make informed decisions.

## **SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY**

#### **Staying Alive**

This unit provides opportunities for students to investigate the basic needs for survival of animals, including humans, and how their senses help them to stay alive. Students' understanding of basic needs and their importance in our lives will be developed through hands-on activities.

## **PDHPE** Keeping Safe and Friendology

Students will continue to explore Friendology where students will learn strategies and skills to become a good friend and keep friendships healthy.

Students will also explore the unit Keeping Safe where students will explore strategies and behaviours, they can incorporate into their daily lives to maintain and promote their emotional, social and physical health and wellbeing.

#### **ENGLISH**

Continuing to create connections between oral language, reading fluency, comprehension, and writing in our learning; underpinned by the latest international research of phonics and phonemic awareness.

This term we will focus on blending and segmenting sounds in words to assist with fluency when reading decodable texts.

## History

## Personal and Family History

Students will have the opportunity to learn about their own history and that of their family; this may include stories from a range of cultures and other parents of the world. As participants in their own history, students build on their knowledge and understanding of how the past is different from the present.

#### **HOMEWORK**

Children will continue to be given decodable readers this term, please ensure these are not misplaced while using them.

Children will also need to write their speech for the public speaking competition in Week 7.

#### **CREATIVE ARTS**

Kindergarten are exploring Visual Arts through Animals, creating multi-media artworks that reflect this unit of work.

Music, Dance and Drama will be explored through specialist music lessons with Mr Warby and through integration into daily topics where students will express themselves through movement and role-playing.
