



TERM 3 CURRICULUM NOTE

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Students will examine how God's Commandments guide Christians to live the Christian life, **explore** Jesus' new commandment in relation to the Ten Commandments, and **develop** a deeper understanding of how the Commandments help us live in right relationship with God and others.

MATHEMATICS

Students will focus on developing mathematical fluency through the following topics:

- 3D spatial structure
- Angles
- Place value
- 2D shapes
- Multiplicative thinking

SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

Earth, Sun and Space

The unit focuses on the Earth's surface and how it changes over time. Students investigate natural processes and human activity to develop a view in relation to sustainable practices. Students explore the effect of the interactions between the Earth and the Sun.

PDHPE

Students will explore our ~~Friendology~~ program where they learn strategies and skills to help them to become a good friend and keep friendships healthy. They will also investigate why it is important to participate in physical activity. In specialist Physical Education lessons, Mrs Frost will teach physical education skills and games.

ENGLISH

Students will deepen their skills in *oral language, reading fluency, comprehension, writing, spelling, handwriting and digital transcription and understanding and responding to literature*. They will also focus on public speaking and prepare and present a speech.

Students will learn about characterisation through the text *The Callers* by Kiah Thomas and perspective and context through the texts "The Little Refugee" by Anh Do and "We are Australian" by Duncan Smith & Nicole Godwin.

HISTORY

Students will explore the diversity and continuous connection of First Nations peoples to Country, examine different perspectives on the establishment of the first British colony in 1788, and develop historical inquiry skills to research, interpret and evaluate information. They will explain and draw conclusions about the people, places and events of the era and their lasting impact on Australian society. This unit will be taught by Mrs Brenda Paul

CREATIVE ARTS

In Visual Arts, students will explore objects through drawing, sculpture and 3D forms.

Dance will be taught through specialist lessons with Mrs Brenda Paul.
